*The meaning of the motif which is running along the right of the number 1 is known as the tikitiki tangata and represents unity. It's indicative of people holding hands and standing together.*

*To the top of the left of the number 1 is the nio mango or sharks teeth which signifies strength and protection. The designs on the zero has been taken from the CSP logo so that the 10 and logo blend together.*

*The leaves to the right of the 0 is the leaves of the young coconut plants to represent the islands and the spearheads modern usage symbolizes one's mettle while facing and overcoming life's challenges. The remaining of the design has a tribal look and feel.*

The National Crime Prevention Coordinator Supt Glen Nicholson Mahina received today 3 laptops, 1 projector and 1 study scholarship from the Commander Vanuatu Australian Policing and Justice Program Detective Supt Melissa Northam on behalf of the Cyber Safety Pasifika.

This support is one of the many supports from the Cyber Safety Pasifika and the Vanuatu Australian Policing and Justice Program to the Vanuatu Police Force.

These equipment will help to enhance the mobility of cyber safety across Vanuatu.

Cyber Safety Pasifika is a regional Cyber Safety Program funded by the Australian Federal Police under the Pacific Policing

Development Program Regional (PPDP-R) and supported by the Pacific Island Chiefs of Police (PICP).

This year marks the 10 years of the establishment of cyber safety in the Pacific.

Vanuatu is one of the pacific countries that is very active with its reporting and activities that VPF Cyber safety Team has been doing in terms of awareness to target cybercrime in Vanuatu.

Detective Supt Melissa Northam acknowledge the VPF's participation in the CSP and assured the VPF in future support and also announced this morning the first cyber security scholarship was given to Vanuatu to enhance the Human Resource of cyber safety with its knowledge on dealing with cyber in Vanuatu.

Receiving speech also acknowledge the support and assured VAPJP and CSP that the equipment will be will be managed to increase the VPF participation in the CSP program. Supt Glen Nicholson also said "That Cyber Policing is the future policing therefore the VPF will increase its participation and also rely on its partners.

## CSP SCHOOL AWARENESS TO OBSERVE SAFER INTERNET DAY2021

Papua New Guinea Safer Internet Day (SID) Committee is a team comprising of different stake holders that runs the Safer Internet Day which is commemorated on 9th February annually and observed globally with the key intent to advocate on safer usage of the internet. The theme for this year is "Together for a Better Internet".

Being a member of the SID committee and a country representative of the Cyber Safety Pasifika Education and Awareness (CSP) program, I was invited as one of the guest speakers to speak to about 300 plus (150 girls & 150 plus boys) grade 11 students of Kilakila Secondary School in Port Moresby on 18/02/2021.

Collaborating with our cybercrime unit investigators, we collectively spoke around cybercrime trends (in PNG) and issues affecting students with the usages of online applications. The advantages and risks associated with online applications relative to criminal offences. How to identify common online offences and when and where to report to police.

# Vanuatu's National Cyber Security Strategy

## Vanuatu's National Cyber Security Strategy, Priority-2 (CSP-2): Cyber Security Awareness.

The Vanuatu Police Force, Cyber Safety Team was part of the Vanuatu National Cyber Security Strategy nationwide consultation last year from August to November 2020 and the Launching on the 9th of March 2021.

The Vanuatu National Cyber Security Strategy (NCSS) 2030 is a plan of action designed to improve 'Security and

Resilience' of Vanuatu's National Critical Infrastructure and

services. It is a mixture of a high-level top-down and

bottom-up approach to cyber security that establishes a range of national objectives and priorities that are

achievable for Vanuatu within the next ten years.



This National Cyber Security Strategy delivers six National Priorities to strengthen National Security by responding to cyber-threats and issues in Vanuatu.

The Strategy Priorities include:

Cyber Resilience;

Cyber Security Awareness;

Cyber Capability and Literacy;

Addressing Cybercrime;

International Engagement; and

Cyber Security Standards and Legal Frameworks.
